Program: "Nub" Allen introduced his nephew, Past District Governor (PDG) Mark Wyse, who brought us up to date on the upcoming Rotary "Council on Legislation" and some of the significant proposals that are up for consideration. Every three years, Rotarians meet at the Council on Legislation to review and vote on proposed changes to the legislation that governs Rotary. They consider enactments, which change Rotary's governing documents, and position statements by the RI Board. Mark is our district representative. He will attend the Council in April in Chicago. He also told us about the new "Council on Resolutions" which meets online every year to vote on proposed resolutions and urgent enactments. Resolutions are requests to the Board or the Trustees to take an action that is outside the purview of the constitutional documents. They are not binding while the actions of the Council on Legislation are.
