Program: Bob Woodhouse introduced Brad Butler, executive director and curator at Main Street Arts which is a nonprofit arts organization and art gallery specializing in showcasing contemporary art and fine craft from emerging and established Upstate New York artists. Brad told us that Main Street Arts offers exhibitions, an artist residency program, workshops, and youth programs. The current exhibition is entitled “Making Space: An Exhibition by Mirabo Press”. This exhibition features the individual and collaborative works of Mizin Shin, Rachel Shelton, and Bob Fleming. Works included consist of printmaking, painting, sculpture, and installation by the three co-owners of Mirabo Press in Buffalo, NY. There are six more exhibitions scheduled in 2022. On premises is a fantastic Arts Resource Library that is open for public browsing and research. Just walk in. For more information go to: mainstreetartscs.org. Brad also told us about Sulfur Books. This is an independent bookstore owned by Main Street Arts, a non-profit arts organization. In addition to classics, it features bestselling fiction, and nonfiction. You’ll also find books for children, middle readers, and young adults. We are so very lucky to have these wonderful resources in our village which contribute significantly to the quality of life for all. Great presentation!
