PROGRAM (Cont.) Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) is a framework for effective team-based problem solving that is data-informed, evidence-based, and flexible enough to meet the academic and behavioral needs of all students. Tiered-prevention logic emphasizes the following guiding principles;



- All students should experience an effective and relevant foundation.
- Implemented across the entire school.
- Invest in prevention first.
- Establish a continuum of support tailored to address the needs of ALL students.
- Select and use evidence-based practices.
- Build local capacity with assistance and support.
- Document high fidelity of implementation.
- Decide with data.
- Enhance implementation to be culturally relevant.
