PROGRAM: Jericho Banker, President of the Lima Rotary Club, presented a very informative and timely program on Rotary and our effort to end human trafficking world-wide and in our local area. She told us about Julie Chapus who is a social worker, cosmetologist and instructor. Julie’s dream is to open a Cosmetology School that can hire survivors of human trafficking. She currently has a curriculum but can only help a few at a time. This program can give survivors a real chance at earning a living wage, get out of poverty and decrease recidivism. Miss Julie’s School of Beauty, located in Rush, NY, gives them a new chance at life.



Jericho told us that we have the opportunity to help with one of Rotary’s main Objectives- Helping Women. We can’t provide a school, but we can help with some of the costs. There are many clubs in the district and if we can help secure some district grant funding for her project we can make this mission a reality!

There is no other program like this. “We are a nonprofit cosmetology school, empowering survivors of human trafficking through vocational training...”- Julie Chapus.

It is worth noting that the Monroe County South Rotary Club has rebranded itself and is now a cause-based club entitled the District 7120 E-Club whose focus will be not only ending human trafficking but assisting those who have been, and are, victims of this horrible, and all too common, scourge in our communities.
