February is **Rotary Peace and Conflict Prevention/Resolution Month**

As a humanitarian organization, peace is a cornerstone of our mission. We believe when people work to create peace in their communities, that change can have a global effect.

By carrying out service projects and supporting **peace fellowships and scholarships**, our members take action to address the underlying causes of conflict, including poverty, discrimination, ethnic tension, lack of access to education, and unequal distribution of resources.

There are seven **Rotary Peace Centers** around the world.:

**Duke University and University of North Carolina** at Chapel Hill.

**International Christian University**, Tokyo, Japan.

**University of Bradford**, Bradford, UK.

**University of Queensland**, Brisbane, Australia.

**Uppsala University**, Uppsala, Sweden.

**Chulalongkorn University**, Bangkok, Thailand.

**Makerere University**, Kampala, Uganda

Master's degree programs are offered in 15 to 24 month programs that include a two- to three-month field study. Certificate studies are also offered at premier universities.

The fellowships cover tuition and fees, room and board, round-trip transportation, and internship and field-study expenses.

Since the program began in 2002, the **Rotary Peace Centers** have trained more than 1,600 fellows who now work in over 140 countries. Many serve as leaders in governments; NGOs; education and research institutions; peacekeeping and law enforcement agencies; and international organizations like the United Nations and the World Bank.

Each year, The Rotary Foundation awards up to 50 fellowships for master's degrees and up to 40 for certificate studies.
